## *Perfect World*

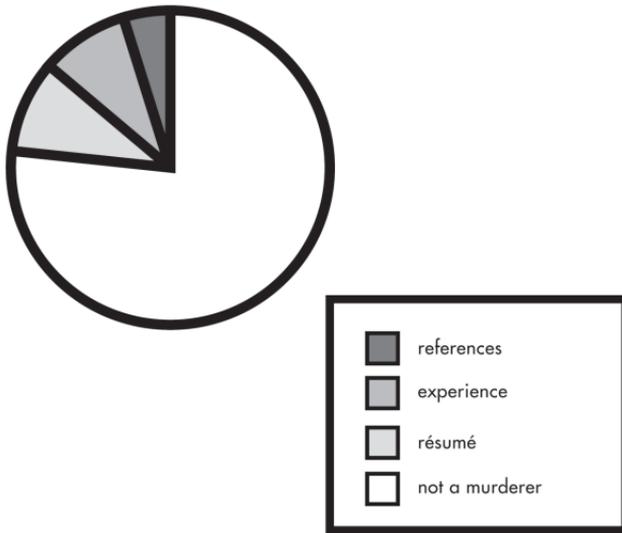

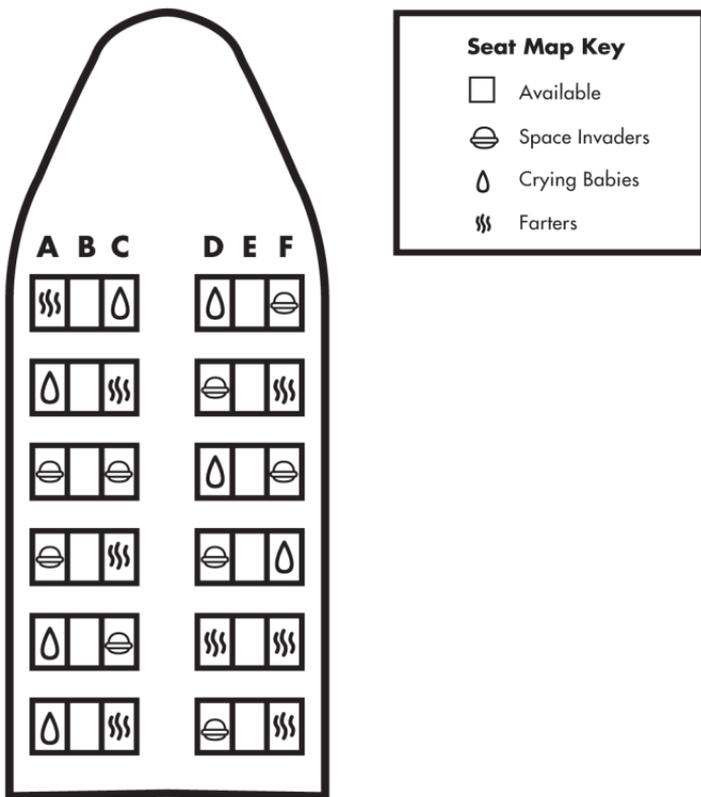
## *Get Real*

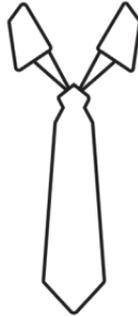
## Employment Necktie Indicator

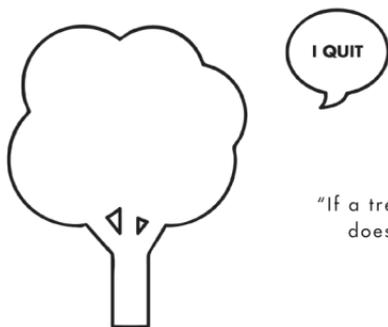

### **1. IKEA/Target**

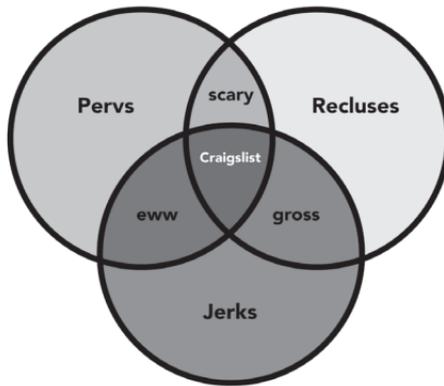

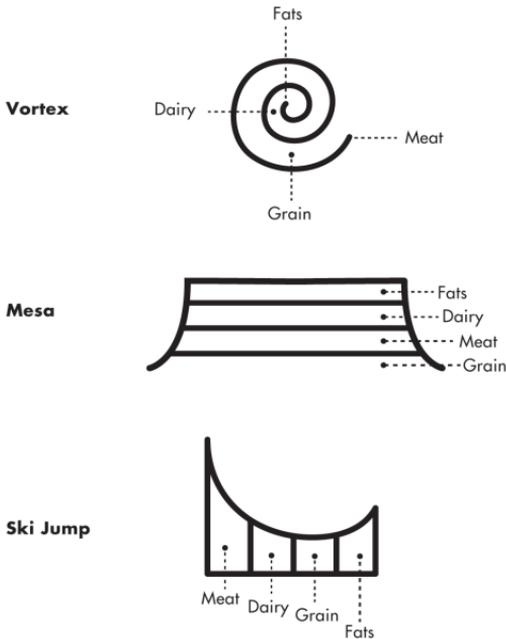

And don't think that because your girlfriend's mother

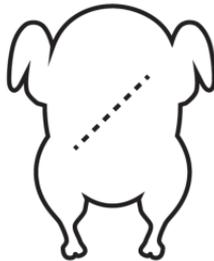

elite lowlifes, so if you don't want to be just another pirate, criminal, or burnout, this tattoo better be special.

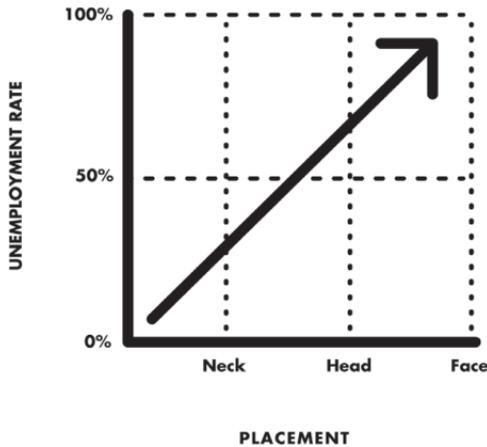

# Picking Up Girls

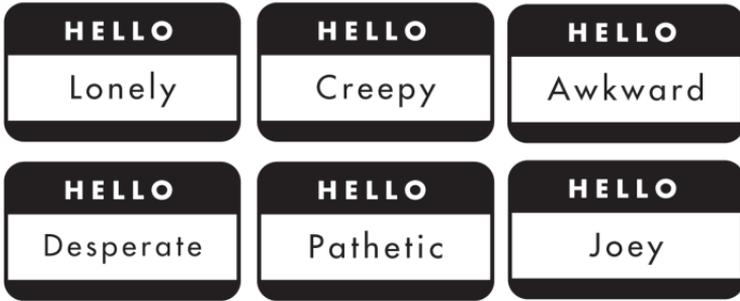
## *Perfect World*

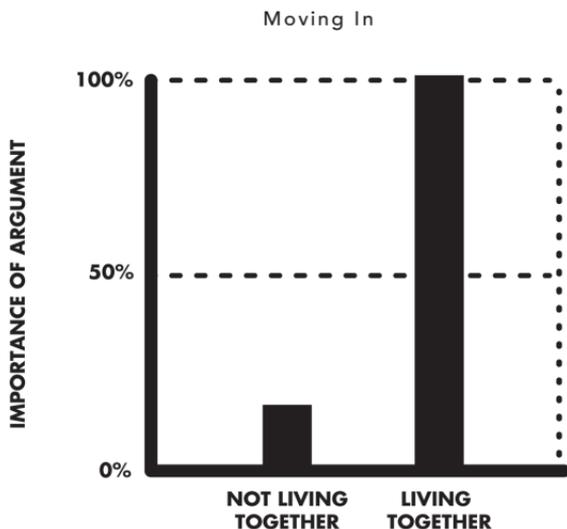
play. No, you're in a "domestic partnership" now, and boy does it feel good.

## *Perfect World*

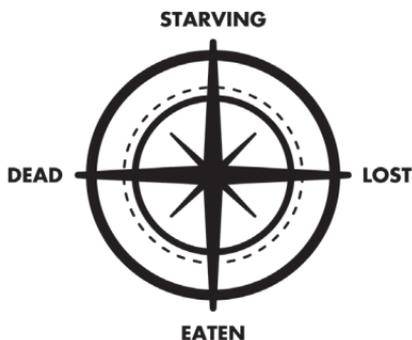

The strip club is a place for your brain to release some chemicals and for you to burn through some cash. And only actual fire can burn through cash faster than the strip club. So keep your wallet and your heart in a cool, dry place because it is about to get real hot in here.

Before you go any further, stop and remember: you are not going into an amoral den of adult entertainment. At best, you're

going to see someone rant for three minutes before arguing on a microphone with the emcee.

There may be a slim chance you'll encounter the next big thing, but you'll more likely discover how much you miss the polished performers on that show Netflix wanted you to watch. Unless you're Berry Gordy looking to sign some new talent (again, this metaphor takes place in the 1960s), avoid the open mic and go do anything else.
